

ACMP Carolinas Chapter – Board of Directors Election Process

The election process for ACMP Carolinas Board of Directors members will be typical of how Board of Directors elections are often managed, but will be different than many other types of elections.

Step 1: Application Period. There will be a minimum of a two-week period, during which applications will be accepted for Board positions. Applicants can only select one position for which she/he would like apply. Applications are submitted by completing an online form ([link](#)).

For the 2021 ACMP Carolinas Board election, the application period will open on September 17th, and close on October 7th.

Step 2: Interview Period. During this time, applicants will be interviewed by the Board. Please see the Board of Directors Expectations, to get a sense for what the current Board will be interested to better understand, as it gets to know applicants during the interview period.

Step 3: Nominations. After the interview period concludes, the Board will then nominate one applicant per position whom it deems to be most fit for the role. Applicants will then be notified of the results and next steps. If an applicant is not nominated, she/he will be encouraged to take on a volunteer role within the Chapter.

If there is still a Board position that is not filled at this point, applicants who did not receive the nomination for their desired position will be encouraged to apply for a remaining position, and the nomination process will then repeat for any remaining open positions.

Step 4: Ratification by Membership: The ACMP Carolinas Chapter will communicate with its members by email, with the slate of nominated board members. Members will be asked to either approve or reject each member. If more than 50% of members who reply approve a nomination, then the election process will be complete for that nominee.

In addition to the email communication, the Chapter will also plan for an annual Membership Meeting, where you can meet and get to know each nominee, as well as ask any questions.
